Portrait / Character Prompt		
“A [character description] wearing [specific clothing and accessories], with [expression or emotion], in front of a [background/environment]. Lighting should be [mood/style], and the art style should resemble [reference: oil painting, anime, realism, etc.]. Include specific features like [scar, hairstyle, eye color, etc.]”

Mention the style you want: Realism, anime, Ghibli, cyberpunk, oil painting, etc. Give context: What is happening? Who is present? What’s the tone?	Don’t leave out key visual features (e.g., mask shapes, clothing details, facial expressions). Don’t rely on vague phrases like “cool scene” or “beautiful picture.” Don’t assume the AI understands implied relationships—spell them out. Don’t skip details like camera angle or lighting, especially when tone matters.
